## **Five prohibited substance breaches disqualify Greyhound Trainer**

Brisbane Greyhound Trainer Claude Dacey has been disqualified for nine months after he pleaded guilty to five prohibited substance breaches, including cobalt in excess of the prescribed threshold.

Mr Dacey faced Queensland Racing Integrity Commission (QRIC) Stewards yesterday after the analysts found prohibited substances in five samples from greyhounds when they raced in Brisbane, Capalaba and Ipswich in October and November last year.

Three positive Phenobarbitone samples were returned for the greyhounds' Nikki Nettle, Power Service and Jeannie Dreaming and two positive Cobalt samples in excess of the prescribed threshold were found in Nikki Nettle and Power Service.

Mr Dacey pleaded guilty to all charges and Stewards disqualified him until 12 December 2019.

Nikki Nettle, Power Service and Jeannie Dreaming were disqualified from their respective events with placings amended and all prize money to be returned.

Mr Dacey has been given two weeks to transfer any registered greyhounds out of his name.
